1. Adoption of agenda

3. Oral Report by Chair and Executive Director

Information

The ESMA Chair reported on:

- The appointment of Mairead McGuiness as European Commissioner for financial stability, financial services and capital markets union;
- His recent interactions with the European Parliament, including the annual hearing of European Supervisory Authorities (ESAs)' Chairs by the European Parliament Committee for Economic and Monetary Affairs (ECON), interactions to ensure an appropriate process for the selection of the ESAs' next respective Chairs, and to discuss the progress on delegated acts under the Sustainable Finance Disclosure Regulation (SFDR);
- The upcoming finalisation of the setting-up of ESMA's CCP Supervisory Committee with the planned arrival of its Chair and Independent Members;
- The plan to send out a call for candidates for the Management Board and the holding of an election, following the expiration of half of the terms of the Management Board members;
- The activities of the ESAs' Joint Committee, in particular its agreement on the need for further cooperation between ESAs and the European Commission in order to provide clarity on how to bridge the time between application of the legislation and the delayed application of delegated acts, and the observed difficulties stemming from the new process on Q&As;
- The activities of the Securities and Markets Stakeholder Group, in particular the upcoming joint meeting with the Board of Supervisors;
- ESMA's international activities, in particular the ESMA Chair's chairing of the IOSCO Financial Stability Engagement Group (FSEG) sub-group on credit ratings, co-chairing the Financial Stability Board (FSB) Standing Committee on Assessment of Vulnerabilities (SCAV) Credit Rating



Workstream, and contributions to the FSB SCAV and FSB Steering Committee on non-banking financial intermediation (NBFI), and the Executive Director's engagement as co-lead of Workstream 3 of IOSCO Sustainable Finance Task Force;

- The status of ESMA's application for membership of the Network for Greening the Financial System (NGFS); and
- The activities of the European Systemic Risk Board (ESRB), in particular the ESRB recommendation on liquidity risk in investment funds and the report to be provided by ESMA to the ESRB upon the Board of Supervisors' approval, as well as the ESRB's ongoing discussions on whether to extend until mid-2021 its recommendation on restriction of dividend distribution by financial institutions (including CCPs).
