The ESMA Chair reported on the:

- recent interactions with the European institutions;
- recent activities and the upcoming meeting of the Securities Markets Stakeholder Group (SMSG);
- meeting of the Joint Committee of the 3 ESAs that took place on 17 June 2026 and the annual meeting with the ESAs Board of Appeal;
- implementation of DORA and importance of enhanced supervisory convergence related to DORA;
- meeting of the General Board of the ESRB of 25 June 2026;
- international activities, and in particular visit to the United Kingdom in May, as well as recent meetings of IOSCO and FSB;
- request from the Court of Justice related to a preliminary ruling case;
- progress towards implementation of T+1 settlement; and
- meeting of the Management Board held on 30 June 2026.
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The Executive Director reported on:

- the meetings of the Financial Services Committee held on the 6 May and 17 June; and
- US – EU Regulatory Dialogue held on 9-10 June 2026.

The Chair of the CCP Supervisory Committee reported on the progress related to negotiations with Indian authorities on concluding a MoU between ESMA and SEBI as well as discussions with the Indian CCPs related to the re-recognition as third-country CCPs under EMIR.

The Head of the Economics and Financial Stability and Risk Department (ESR) presented TRV Risk Monitor, No.2, 2026.

The Board discussed the TRV Risk Monitor, recent market developments and, in particular, the:

- geopolitical tensions and the reaction of financial markets;
- impact of liquidity and leverage on market valuations;
- development of the prediction markets, and possible risks to the broader financial markets; and
- recent IPOs of large technological companies, and their possible impact on financial markets as well as on investor protection.

Decision: The Board discussed and agreed with the main developments presented in the TRV Risk Monitor, No.2, 2026. It will be further updated in August 2026 and submitted for approval by written procedure before publication.

The Board discussed the reports and, in particular, the:

- preliminary findings indicating a moderate but still limited uptake of EU clearing and the expectations around the next steps with the aim to have a final report in 2027; and
- suggestion to distinguish the EU based clearing members with ultimate parent based in a third country from those with ultimate parent based in the EU.

Decision: The Board adopted the Interim report on Active Account Requirement Effectiveness and the JMM Annual Report, and agreed on their publication.

6. Progress update on simplification and burden reduction across ESMA

The Chair of the Proportionality and Coordination Committee presented the report on Simplification and Burden Reduction (SBR) initiatives across ESMA.

The Board discussed the SBR initiatives and, in particular, the:

- support for the ongoing ESMA “flagship” projects for simplification in the areas of reporting (comprehensive review of transaction reporting, integrated reporting for funds), investor journey and risk-based supervision;
- importance of clear communication on various ESMA SBR initiatives in a holistic way;
- drivers of complexity, including level 1 requirements, importance of additional guidance to ensure convergence across the EU as well as speed of interpretation of legal requirements;
- importance of consistent implementation of new regulatory requirements from the start and ongoing work on convergent approaches to supervision;
- need to facilitate cultural change across ESMA and NCAs to contribute to simplification of the financial regulation;
- benefits of developing more precise measurement of outcome of the various SBR initiatives;
- feasibility of an additional SBR “flagship” initiative, e.g. in the area of issuers.

Decision: The Board adopted the report on Simplification and Burden Reduction initiatives across ESMA.

The Board discussed the final report and, in particular, the:

- support for the holistic review as a key ESMA contribution to the SBR initiative;
- importance for ESMA to receive legal empowerment to further develop the proposed changes;
- need for ongoing discussion with the industry and careful management of the change in requirements given the implication on the reporting systems; and
- need to continue ensuring quality of the reported data.

Decision: The Board adopted the Final Report of the Holistic review of the regulatory reporting and agreed on its publication.

8. Market abuse TSI project – outcomes and way forward

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The Head of the Data Intelligence and Technology (DIT) Department presented the outcomes and way forward of the Market abuse TSI project.

The Board discussed the outcomes of the TSI project and, in particular, the:

- support for ESMA to further develop common analytical tools that can be used at national level, in addition to the existing national market surveillance tools and considering cross-border EU-wide perspective;
- importance of proportionality in implementation of such analytical tools as well as different starting points of the NCAs in relation to their national analytical tools; and
- need for additional work to develop the next steps, including considerations related to data privacy and use of AI tools.

Conclusion: The Board took note of the outcomes of the Market abuse TSI project and agreed with the proposed way forward.

9. Follow up to peer review on supervision of cross-border activities of investment firms

The Head of the Investor Protection and Intermediaries Unit, in his role as Chair of the Peer Review Committee, presented the follow up report to the peer review on supervision of cross-border activities of investment firms.

The Board discussed the peer review report and, noted in particular, the:

- importance that all NCAs across the EU, including those not included in the exercise, build on its findings and strengthen their practices as needed;
- opportunity to continue strengthening cooperation and mutual trust; and
- importance of data on activities of cross-border investment firms and implication of proposals in RIS package on reporting of cross border activities of investment firms.

Conclusion: The Board discussed the follow-up report to the peer review on supervision of cross-border activities of investment firms. According to the Peer Review Methodology, the peer review report will be submitted for approval to the Board of Supervisors by written procedure.

- developments in the broader global regulatory environment;
- possible risks stemming from the distribution of complex products and private market placements to retail investors;
- risks stemming from the use of advanced artificial intelligence models and emergence of quantum computing;
- proper balance of risk and opportunities stemming from technological innovation; and
- use of supervisory judgment to assess risk evolution across time and the related supervisory efforts to be devoted.

Decision: The Board adopted the Heatmap 2027. The Board adopted the 2026 annual Union Strategic Supervisory Priorities assessment for the USSP on Cyber and digital operational resilience, and conclusions for the ESG Disclosures USSP, and agreed the launch of the new USSP on Innovation with

investors safeguards from 2027. The Board agreed to publish summary versions of the USSP factsheets on the ESMA website.
