4	Purpose of the processing	<p>Under Directive 98/26/EC (SFD) and Regulation (EU) No 909/2014 (CSDR), ESMA publishes various lists:</p> <p><input type="checkbox"/> According to Article 10 of SFD, Member States shall notify the payment and securities settlement systems and the respective system operators which are to be included in the scope of SFD. Member States shall also inform ESMA of the authorities chosen in accordance with Article 6(2) of SFD to be notified of a decision of opening of insolvency proceedings against a participant in a system.</p> <p>ESMA publishes two lists under the SFD on its website [SFD designated systems and SFD designated authorities] which are updated as necessary.</p> <p><input type="checkbox"/> According to Article 11 of CSDR, each Member State shall designate one or more competent authorities responsible for carrying out the duties under CSDR for the authorisation and supervision of central securities depositories (CSDs) established in their respective territory and shall inform ESMA thereof.</p> <p>ESMA publishes the list of such competent authorities on its website [CSDR competent authorities].</p> <p><input type="checkbox"/> According to Article 12 of CSDR, three other types of authorities shall be involved in the authorisation and supervision of CSDs, where specifically referred to in CSDR.</p> <p>ESMA publishes the list of such relevant authorities on its website [CSDR relevant authorities].</p> <p>Under both SFD and CSDR, authorities shall communicate and exchange information with each other on an on-going basis, as well as with SFD system operators, in particular upon declaration of insolvency proceedings. In order to facilitate communication and cooperation amongst these entities, ESMA collects and stores the names and contact details of their relevant personnel and circulates them to the concerned authorities.</p>
