Marta Božina Beroš is an Associate Professor at the Faculty of Economics, Juraj Dobrila University of Pula (Croatia), where she teaches on EU finance and EMU law & governance. She is also member of the teaching staff of the PhD studies in Law at the University of Siena. Božina Beroš graduated *cum laude* from the Faculty of Law, University of Zagreb, and holds a Ph.D. in Economics from the University of Ljubljana. Her primary research interests are in EMU integration dynamics, specifically how these dynamics affect ESA policymaking (particularly that of the EBA), also taking into account the BU framework. Her broad research interests also include the evolution of European payments in the context of an increasingly digitalized banking market. She has written extensively on these topics, with publications appearing in the Journal of Common Market Studies, the Maastricht Journal of Comparative and European Law, the Palgrave Series in Banking and Finance and E. Elgar Commentaries in Financial Law.

Prior to joining the academia, she worked for the Croatia's Ministry of European and Foreign Affairs, and during her academic career she was a visiting researcher at the: Centre for Commercial Law Studies, Queen Mary University, the UNIDROIT in Rome, and at the Graduate School of Finance, Accounting and Law, Waseda University. Božina Beroš was awarded two Jean Monnet Module grants, and a S4D4C grant to promote science diplomacy. She currently participates to the Jean Monnet Project on "European Legal Strategies for Payment Systems in the Open Banking Age" coordinated by the University of Siena, as well as to the Jean Monnet Chair "EU Money Law" (EUMOL) at the same university. Furthermore, she is member of the Horizon 2020 project "Integrating Diversity in the EU" or "InDivEU" coordinated by the European University Institute.
