Niamh Moloney is Professor of Financial Markets Law at the London School of Economics and Political Science, and holds degrees from Harvard Law School and Trinity College Dublin. She specializes in EU financial market regulation and wrote the first book on this topic (*EC Securities Regulation*, 2 edition, Oxford University Press, 2008; a third edition will be published in 2014). Her other books include: *The Regulatory Aftermath of the Global Financial Crisis* (with Professors Eilís Ferran, Jennifer Hill and Jack Coffee) (Cambridge University Press, 2012), *Law Reform and Financial Markets* (ed., with Professor Kern Alexander, Elgar, 2011), and *How to Protect Investors: Lessons from the EC and the UK* (Cambridge University Press, 2010). She is an Editorial Board Member of a number of leading journals and a Series Editor of the Cambridge University Press monograph Series on International Corporate Law and Capital Market Regulation. She has been a Visiting Professor in a number of leading institutions internationally and will be International Visiting Professor at Columbia Law School, New York in April 2014. Niamh's external appointments include, in addition to the Securities and Markets Stakeholder Group: Fellow (Household Finance), Centre for Financial Studies, Frankfurt; Member, Research Advisory Council, Sustainable Architecture for Finance in Europe, Frankfurt; Member, Central Bank of Ireland, Consumer Advisory Group; and Trustee, Academy of European Law, Trier. Niamh has also served as a member of the UK Financial Conduct Authority's advisory Financial Services Consumer Panel and has acted as an Expert Witness to UK Parliament Select Committee Inquiries on financial market regulation matters.
